## **Adults:**



64% of LGBTQ+ households experienced employment loss compared to 45% of non-LGBTQ+ households, including:

- Having lost a job or business, or been furloughed
- Having wages or hours reduced or taking a mandatory unpaid leave



66%

of LGBTQ+ households have had a serious financial problem paying utilities and other bills





38% of LGBTQ+ households have been unable to get medical care or delayed getting medical care for a serious problem vs. 19% of non-LGBTQ+ households

## People of Color (POC):



LGBTQ+ POC disproportionately report being laid off or furloughed and struggling to pay for basic needs 1/3

1/3 of LGBTQ+ POC personally knew someone who died of COVID-19 compared to 1/5 of non-LGBTQ+ white people

29% of LGBTQ+ POC report problems affording basic household goods compared to 14% of non-LGBTQ+ white people



26% of LGBTQ+ POC report having trouble paying their rent or mortgage compared to 9% of non-LGBTQ+ white people



LGBTQ+ POC are twice as likely as non-LGBTQ+ white people to test positive for COVID-19
